
Music Lessons

Trips

North Farm Trip – Year 10 26th June 2025

A group of 40 Year 10 pupils visited a local farm to explore real-world STEM applications. They had a fantastic trip and engaged incredibly well with all of the activities throughout the day.

The pupils learned how technology supports sustainable agriculture, including a focus on crop rotation, soil quality and production of food. A guided tour showed them the milk parlour, hoof treatment and crops throughout the farm.

The pupils also had the opportunity to meet with local businesses and education providers, with a number of hands-on activities including a tractor simulator and fake artificial insemination.

The trip highlighted the importance of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics in modern farming, with the hope of inspiring many pupils to consider STEM careers in the future.









Ice Skating

During terms 3 and 4, a selected group of Year 8 boys were involved in a programme that aimed to improve engagement and attitude to learning across the curriculum. Pupils responded very positively during the programme and showed improvement in either behaviour, attendance or in building positive relationships with staff.

As a result of their determination and improvement, those who had made the biggest difference to their mindset were rewarded with a trip at the end of term 5. The boys chose to go ice-skating at the Link Centre.

During the session, the boys demonstrated their resilience and positive attitudes, with many moving from being novices to competent skaters by the end of the two hours. They all had a fantastic time and were discussing going back that same night for the late skate.

We are really proud of how this group of boys have turned their behaviour around and hope that they continue to maintain their maturity and positive behaviour as they enter Year 9.

Trips

Year 7 Maths Trip to Bletchley Park

On Wednesday 25th June 2025, a group of 59 pupils and 6 staff members visited the world-renowned Bletchley Park, the historic home of British codebreaking during World War II.

Pupils explored the original codebreaking huts and museum exhibitions, gaining fascinating insights into the vital work carried out by Alan Turing and his colleagues. The visit brought classroom learning to life, linking mathematics, history, and computing in a meaningful and memorable way.

Throughout the day, pupils engaged in interactive workshops and hands-on activities, including a close look at the Enigma machine and real wartime cipher challenges. The experience deepened their understanding of cryptography, problem-solving, and the importance of collaboration under pressure. It was a fantastic opportunity to celebrate the role of mathematics in shaping the modern world, while also inspiring our pupils to think critically, work together, and appreciate the impact of perseverance and innovation.

Year 10 Geography fieldtrip to River Cole

On Monday 16th June 2025, the Year 10 Geographers completed their first piece of fieldwork for their GCSE.

Pupils collected primary data (the width, depth and velocity) on both a straight and meander section of the River Cole, so that they will be able to compare the characteristics at different locations and to be able to answer their enquiry question.

Pupils also collected secondary data and had a talk from someone who worked at the National Trust site, to gain an understanding of how the river has been managed over time and what different strategies have been put in place to try and restore the river to its natural state.

Pupils will now use the data in order to complete a write up, and produce graphs to analyse and to use them in order to help them answer their hypothesis question.



Pupils were really engaged throughout the trip and all got involved and became true Geographers for the day... including someone getting their wellies stuck in the mud!

Mock Trial competition

On Saturday 14th June our Mock Trial pupils, Emily S, Emmy K, Harry E, Holly P, Joshua H, Lena W, Mia D, Nicola S, Oakley V-C, Thomas J, Toby P, Tyler R and William W, headed to Croydon to compete in the final national rounds of the competition. They had an early start, leaving school at 6:30am. The trip was one of excitement and hope.

We started the day with a Q&A session, a magistrate spoke to the pupils enabling them to understand the job opportunities within the legal system, and the different pathways into the legal profession.

We then headed into our first round of the competition. We were up against Gunnersbury Catholic School and our pupils took to the prosecution first. We fought hard on a very difficult case but ultimately the defendant was found not guilty, however it wasn't a straight forward win as a Magistrate on each team found the defendant guilty.

Our second round of the competition was against Waddeston Church of England School. This time we ran the case as defence. Our defence team were very good and argued the case well. This time it was down to the judging Magistrate to make the final decision as we had a split, the Waddeston magistrates voted guilty and our Magistrates voted not guilty. The presiding Magistrate had the deciding vote, not guilty.

Unfortunately, we did not place in the top three of the competition however, we did place 6th overall out of the 11 schools present – which is still an incredible achievement for our pupils.

The result did not dampen our teams spirit, it was wonderful listening to them all congratulate each other and say how proud they all are of getting to the London competition. It was also a great chance for them to meet pupils from all over the country, including Belfast, and interact with them.

Overall, we are immensely proud of how our pupils performed in the competition and represented our school. We celebrated with a well-deserved, and much needed McDonalds at the services on the way home!

The pupils themselves gained a lot from this experience and hopefully some will join us with next years group, taking on a mentor role, much as Angelica W from last years winning team did this year.


Swindon Station and the team at Great Western Railway have invited Abbey Park

Well, we have come to the end of another very busy year here in the APS Library. We have seen over 3,000 books borrowed by our KS3 pupils over the year.

We have had several Word Millionaires with Beth D in Y8 our champion of the year reading just under 7 million words!! And between them KS3 have passed 3,891 quizzes on books.

To make the library easier to access, we will be having a change around over the summer, with non-fiction becoming subject based to help support and extend the pupils learning. We will also be making room for the new books we have got, including a few more Manga and Graphic novels, which have proven very popular with our pupils.

Over the summer, we have set the pupils a 'Summer Reading Challenge' these will be on Epraise. Y7 and Y8 have the choice to do an independent novel study or Book Bingo. Year 9s have the challenge of reading their set text ready for GCSEs.

It is really important that pupils try to read every day, even if it's just for 10 minutes, to maintain good reading standards which will help across all their subjects. Our aim is that reading ages should match their chronological age, enabling them to access the required texts and exam papers at GCSE level.

However, this should be fun, so read books and articles they will enjoy, the latest sports reports, recipes, comics, if you're on holiday get them to read a guide book or perhaps the menu if you are out for dinner.

At Abbey Park we are committed to ensuring a culture of safeguarding in our school and it is paramount in all we do. We hope that our termly safeguarding update will give you an overview of our approach, offer some useful guidance and information and inform you of what your child is learning in school about how to keep themselves safe. What does Safeguarding look like at Abbey Park?

At Abbey Park School we follow the Government policy document 'Keeping Children Safe in Education'. This is statutory guidance for all schools in England to follow and comply with. It has recently been updated and therefore our safeguarding policy has been updated to reflect this. You can find this on our safeguarding section on the school website. Safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children is **everyone's responsibility**. Everyone who comes into contact with children and their families has a role to play in making sure that children grow up having the best life chances. In order to fulfill this responsibility effectively, all adults should make sure their approach puts the child at the centre of the decision making and that the best interests of the child are always considered. We believe that it is in the best interest of our children to have opportunities to learn how to stay safe both in and outside of school. Our safeguarding themes are weven into lessons across the curriculum, into assemblies and throughout daily life in school. Here are just a few examples of how we teach safeguarding at Abbey Park:

- Dedicated safeguarding team in school every day
- Pastoral support for each year group.
- Pastoral Support Assistants who have specialist training in supporting a child in their social and emotional needs
- · Members of staff who have completed basic mental health training
- Mental health pupil ambassadors
- Mental health staff ambassadors
- A dedicated mental health lead Mrs Stevens
- Wellbeing Wednesday each Wednesday Tutor time looking at how to look after mental health
- Assemblies and lessons taught throughout the year, including but not extensively, anti-bullying, equality, diversity, fire, sun, children's safety, exploitation, sexual harassment and violence and online safety.
- PHSE curriculum covering how to be healthy, having healthy relationships and developing emotional literacy
- Online safety curriculum
- RSE (Relationships and sex education) curriculum
- Weekly tutor time reminders about staying safe in school and our expectations

Paracetamol – we will not issue any paracetamol to pupils during P5 to ensure pupils do not take another dose at home.


